According to the National Women's Business Council, as of 2012 there were 9,932,424 womenowned businesses in the United States, however when it comes to women run law firms the numbers were few and far between. In fact, in 2013 the American Bar Association reported that women make up only 34% of the legal profession, and of those women only 20.2% were partners in the firms. As of April 2015, only 12 of the largest 100 U.S. run law firms have a woman in their highest leadership position. The Quattro Firm strives to make a change in these numbers.

Alice went into business for herself because she just didn't like working for someone else. She always felt under-valued and so she thought it was time to do



her own thing. This way, she could feel free to do things her own way without restrictions. Anyone who has met Alice could definitely attest that she has her own way of doing things and to restrict her is to bind her

creativity. She's a butterfly who needs the room to stretch her wings.

As far as Alice's competitors, Alice sets herself apart by showing up and trying to leave her ego at home. She understands that the client's wants come first and she's not going to stifle anyone else's creativity. Alice joked that she also plays well with others. In a creative field, getting along with people is a must.

Alice began her career in the sign business and was often up a ladder painting signs. At the time it was novel for a woman to be in this business because people didn't imagine a woman climbing up ladders and scaffolding. Its is perceived as not being a womanly thing to do, but this is exactly what Alice celebrates and enjoys about her career. She likes to go against the assumption and enjoys all the physical work that comes with the creative.

Occasionally and most especially in foreign countries, Alice has faced some adversity with being a woman in what has traditionally been a male dominated field. The cultural implications in some countries can be problematic because the men refuse to deal with a woman. Regardless, Alice thrives and does not feel that she will ever need a man to speak for her.

The best part about Alice's profession for her is playing with paint and making a mess. She loves drawing, the mental aspect of planning out a project and designing. It satisfies her need to constantly be juggling many tasks and since she will be painting on one project and designing on mirror for the next, she's never bored.

Alice's favorite projects are anything involving painting, but she also loves the planning production projects. Alice is always up for a challenge and enjoys new types of projects in different venues with different materials. She boasts that by the time she's finished the project, she will have finally figured it out.

Of all of the amazing projects that she has done, from work in famous homes like Gianni Versace and Sting to designing pieces for restaurants and bars, Alice listed two as her ultimate favorites: Sloan's and Blue Provence. Sloan's has given Alice the ability to work globally in all of their franchises and to produce whimsical designs. Blue Provence was the first customer to give Alice the instructions



"do what you want" and actually mean it.

As far as advice for other entrepreneurial women, Alice had many words of wisdom. First she advises that you should do something and like it or don't do it at all. However, she did say that it's still okay to let guys carry the heavy things for you.

We loved sitting down with Alice and getting an insight in to her creative success. She both inspired us and made us laugh with her stories of how she began her career and how she's sustained it.
